

**BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT BANK OF CANADA (“BDC”)
and BDC CAPITAL INC. (“BDC Capital”)**

ANNUAL REPORT on the ACCESS TO INFORMATION ACT

Reporting period: April 1, 2011 to March 31, 2012

1. Purpose of the Law

The purpose of the Access to Information Act (the “*Act*”) is to extend the present laws of Canada to provide a right of access to information in records under the control of a government institution in accordance with the principles that government information should be available to the public, that necessary exceptions to the right of access should be limited and specific and that decisions on the disclosure of government information should be reviewed independently of government.

2. Preparation and submission

This report is prepared and tabled in Parliament in accordance with section 72 of the *Act*.

3. Mandate

BDC’s mandate, as set out in the *Business Development Bank of Canada Act*, is to support Canadian entrepreneurship by providing financial, consulting and venture capital services. BDC’s investments may be held in the name of BDC Capital, a wholly-owned subsidiary of BDC. All administration of such investments is performed by BDC employees, using BDC resources and facilities. All relevant records relating to BDC Capital are under the control of BDC.

4. Organization of Access to Information activities, policies and procedures

Procedures are in place for directing formal access requests to the Access to Information Coordinator who ensures that they are processed in accordance with the provisions of the *Act*. The Coordinator is normally occupied part-time at BDC’s Montreal Head Office in carrying out his responsibilities pursuant to the *Act*, although he is available at all times together with other administrative support, to process requests as the volume of activity may warrant. Delegated by the President & CEO, the Director, Corporate Compliance (who is the Coordinator), the Assistant Vice President, Legal Affairs, the Counsel and Assistant Corporate Secretary and the Senior Vice President, Legal Affairs and Corporate Secretary are currently exercising the powers, duties and functions under the *Act* and report to BDC’s President & CEO on access to information matters.

BDC receives requests from varied sources and for all types of information throughout the year. BDC’s approach in determining whether to deal with such requests informally or whether to require the requestor to make a formal request under the *Act* depends on the complexity of the investigation and exemption process. Decisions on waiving application and processing fees permitted under the *Act* are made on a case-by-case basis.

5. Delegation

A copy of the Delegation Order is attached.

6. Statistical Report

As outlined in the attached statistical report, BDC received twelve new formal requests in this reporting period. In relation to the twelve requests that were completed, the relevant records were fully disclosed in four of these files. Portions of the records were exempt in five of the files and BDC was unable to process the remaining three files since it had no relevant records. In addition, there were eight formal consultations from other departments and agencies concerning requests they received in which some BDC-related records were involved.

The percentage breakdown for the source of requests received during this reporting period is as follows:

Media: 16%
Business: 75%
Public: 9%

7. Training

During the reporting period, no training activities were performed.

8. Policies, Guidelines and Procedures

During the reporting period, BDC did not implement any new or revised access to information policies, guidelines or procedures.

9. Complaints and Investigations

During the reporting period, BDC dealt with the Office of the Information Commissioner concerning seven complaints and investigations. These complaints were filed for delay from the same requester. Two of them were discontinued and five of them were resolved without a formal recommendation made to the head of institution. Two other complaints were filed in relation with two requests in which BDC claimed exemption for records it considered to have proprietary and strategic value; these complaints are still active and waiting for an investigator to be assigned.

These designation and delegation replace all previous delegation orders.


